SUBJECT: Thailand Case

As you suggested, I communicated with Inspector Gramolini to determine the Force's position with respect to details in the Thailand case report that the RCMP may feel would be injurious to law enforcement. I also mentioned it to Deputy Commissioner Murray who told me that Inspector Gramolini would provide me with the Force's position.

Inspector Gramolini telephoned me on March 16, 1992, and sought my views on the matter. I told him that I did not think that there any items in the report that would be injurious to law enforcement, but that the Commission was anxious to receive the opinion of the RCMP, particularly with reference to:

- 1) international relations
- 2) wiretapping in a foreign country, and
- 3) RCMP technical equipment used in a foreign country.

I reiterated that I did not think that any of these items would be injurious to law enforcement. Inspector Gramolini was not certain as the course of action which should be followed, but generally shared my views. I concluded by telling him that I would read the report again and if there was anything which I thought should be brought to his attention, I would do so in order for him to review his position.
